

Before coming the Police Chief of Liverpool, Ronnie started out with the Brazoria County Sheriff's Office in 1978, he also worked at the Alvin Police Department and was a Criminal Investigator for the Limestone County Sheriff's Office. Ronnie has been a big asset to the city. He helped to bring the Police Department up to date with more modern technology. Chief Nance has dedicated his life to being a Police Officer, and to Serve and Protect the people of Brazoria County, and Liverpool. Chief Nance is retiring with the highest admiration and respect that can be given by all the City of Liverpool's Staff, Mayor and Council. WATER: As many of you know we have had an ongoing problem with the arsenic levels in the water going up. We have spent months trying to get the problem fixed. We had the media replaced in the arsenic removal system and we are currently waiting for the test results to determine if that was the problem. The media is a sand base that filters the arsenic out of the water. This is not an emergency, and we are not enforcing a boil notice. We have not been reprimanded by TCEQ. We are working hard to resolve the problem and will keep everyone updated.
