We invite you to enjoy a parade, hot dogs and hamburgers with all the fixings, potato salad, chips, desserts, a photo booth, a car show, live music by Austin Slade during the picnic and car show, trinkets, giveaways, raffle items, and fun for the whole community. Come be part of the parade, watch from the streets, enter the car show, or vote for your favorite car. Parade lineup begins at 9:00 AM on St. Anne Street, and the parade starts at 10:00 AM. The car show will begin right after the parade, food will be served at about 11:00 AM, trophies will be awarded at about 12:00 PM, and raffle drawings will follow the trophy presentation.
